Nathan is a soon-to-be

graduate of Cary-Grove High School who has had an interest in reptiles and amphibians for as long as he can remember. He will enter Southern Illinois University -Carbondale this fall, majoring in wildlife biology and conservation. He has assisted with several regional herpetofaunal inventories, assisted the McHenry County Conservation District in a survey of smooth green snakes, and is currently doing a study on the ecology and distribution of crayfish snakes. He is on the seasonal stewardship staff of the Boone County Conservation District.

Ben is currently a junior at the University of Wisconsin - Stevens Point, majoring in forestry-ecosystem restoration and management, with a focus on botany, plant ecology, and ecosystem restoration. He is a graduate of North Boone High School and Rock Valley College, and has interned with Citizens for Conservation in Barrington, Illinois. He has also worked as a seasonal employee for the Boone County Conservation District.

Plant Sale Update Constance McCarthy

Because the community events at which we normally sell plants, have been cancelled, we are adding an extra weekend to the plant sale. In addition, the first day of the sale (which was originally planned to be for members only) is now open to everyone.

The dates and times of the sale will be as follows:

Thursday, May 7, 3-7 p.m.
Friday, May 8, 3-7 p.m.
Saturday, May 9, 9 a.m. - 2 p.m.
Friday, May 15, 3-7 p.m.
Saturday, May 16, 9 a.m. - 2 p.m.

The sale will take place once again at the Paulson Farm, 4601 Paulson Rd., Caledonia (near SportScore2 and the Northeast YMCA). We are grateful to Jerry Paulson, chapter vice president, for generously hosting the sale at his farm.

Over 90 varieties of woodland, savanna, and prairie native plants will be offered for sale, including forbs, ferns, grasses, sedges, and a two varieties of small shrubs. You'll also find plants for rain gardens, and for attracting and helping pollinators, butterflies, birds, and other wildlife.

Social distancing must be respected at the sale and folks are requested to wear a mask (in line with the governor's order). If the sale becomes too congested, shoppers may have to wait their turn to browse the plants. We thank you in advance for your patience and cooperation as we attempt to navigate these entirely new circumstances for this year's sale.

Curbside pick-up will be available for orders placed in advance.
